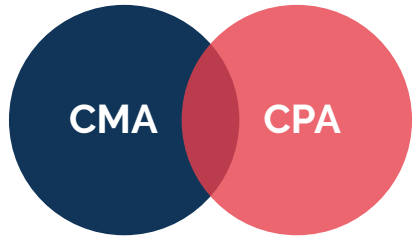


DUAL CERTIFICATION MADE EASY
